

Missionary Puzzle



INSTRUCTIONS FOR 5 OLD TIME PUZZLES

1. MISSIONARIES AND CANNIBALS (13 MOVES)

Three (3) Missionaries and three (3) Cannibals wish to cross a river.

The three Missionaries and but one Cannibal can row a boat.

The boat can accommodate but 2 at a time.

On either shore the Cannibals must not exceed the Missionaries in number.

Get them all across the river.

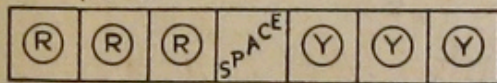
NOTE—Use one color for Missionaries and another for Cannibals. (To distinguish the Cannibal oarsman, turn his tile bottom side up).

2. STAGGERED COLORS

Arrange the 16 blocks (4 each of four colors) within the box so that no two of the same color will be in any one of the ten straight lines (4 horizontal, 4 vertical, and 2 diagonal from corner to corner).

3. CHANGE ABOUT (15 MOVES)

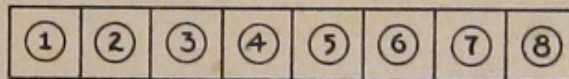
Place 3 reds and 3 yellows in a row in this position



Move one space at a time, or jump one (only) of another color (the same as in checkers) and make the colors change places.

4. DOUBLE UP (4 MOVES)

Place 8 tiles in a row and by jumping one (1), over two (2), make four (4) Kings. (Kings count as two).



5. SORTING OUT (4 MOVES)

Arrange alternately, 4 each of two colors, in a row.



By moving two adjoining tiles at a time, in 4 moves place all of each color together. In the end leave no space between any two tiles.
